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Post-operative Instructions after Intra-vitreous Injection

What is normal after an injection?

- You may notice a bubble, cloud, or floaters in your vision after the injection. These may last for several days.
- The vision will be blurry immediately following the injection, but will gradually clear.
- The eye may be red and may sting or itch for a day or two.
- It is normal to have some bloody tears right after the procedure.

How should I care for my eye after an injection?

- The irritation from the injection should resolve after about 24 hours. During that time, it is okay to place artificial tears in the eye as needed for comfort. You may also continue to use any prescribed medicated eye drops (ie. Glaucoma drops).

You should call our office if you experience any of the following:

- Significant and worsening pain or redness in the injected eye
- Steadily decreasing vision after the injection
